The participating children were distributed with the artworks-drawing sheets, pencils, erasers, crayons etc. supported by DLF Foundation.



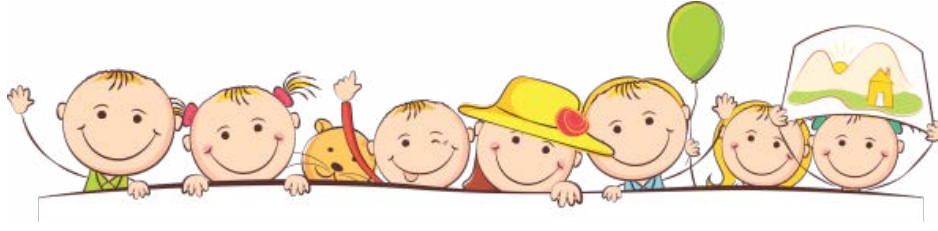


Distribution of Gifts

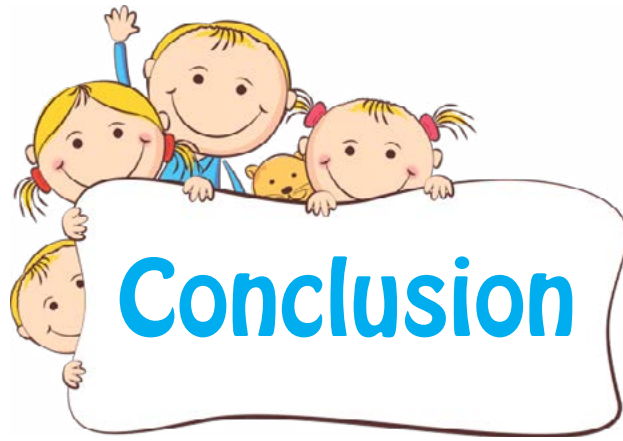
